

COVER STORY: 80 Miles of Trails in your Ocean County Parks

One of the best ways to improve your mental and physical health is through outdoor recreation. Studies have shown that spending just 20 minutes outside can boost your mood, energy, and self-esteem. The Ocean County Department of Parks and Recreation offers a multitude of locations and programs highlighted in this program guide to get you outside and active. The department maintains over 80 miles of marked trails and paths at 23 different Parks, Conservation Areas, and Natural Lands Trust properties within Ocean County. Whether you are looking for a short walk, a long hike, a scenic bike ride, or an opportunity to immerse yourself in nature, you can find plenty of options within your Ocean County Parks!

"One of the great things about Ocean County is the abundance of open space and recreational opportunities available to our residents," said Commissioner

Robert Arace.

Most locations are open from 7:00 a.m. to dusk. Hours are posted at park entrances as well as on the Parks Department website. There's even an award-winning web application called Ocean County Trail Tracker that provides an interactive map, allowing you to use your smartphone to see your location on our trails. Our walking and hiking trails are also marked with visible colored blazes to make

navigating the trails simple!

Our trails are designed and maintained for a variety of users and experiences. Compacted stone dust trails like the Barnegat Branch Trail provide a wide, flat, and stable surface for pedestrians and bicycles to travel with ease. This popular linear park stretches nearly 14 miles from Barnegat to Beachwood. Construction of Phase IX of the Barnegat Branch Trail is scheduled for spring 2025. This new section will extend 0.6 miles from Admiral Avenue in Beachwood Borough to

Herflicker Boulevard in South Toms River Borough.

Other trails, like our newly blazed Michael T. Mangum Trail at Cedar Bridge Tavern Historic Site in Barnegat Township, provide a more immersive trail experience. This 3.6-mile trail has a natural sand and wood chip surface that winds through towering laurels and over trickling Pinelands streams. If off-road biking is more your speed, you can tackle the hills and cedar swamps of the 6.2-mile multi-use trail at Wells Mills County Park. Families with young children can enjoy the 0.5-mile Play Trail at Jakes Branch County Park, where nature-themed play pockets are just waiting to be discovered along the forested trail. There are also great spots like Cattus Island County Park's 0.25-mile boardwalk trail, which affords a stunning view of the marsh and is fully accessible to strollers and wheelchairs. Leashed dogs are welcome companions on all of our trails! We ask that you please clean up after your pet and dispose of waste in trash receptacles.

"Our parks and trails are among the county's greatest assets," added Commissioner Arace. "From our paved and compacted trails to our more rugged

natural paths, Ocean County has a trail for you."

Our trails are maintained by a network of trained staff and volunteers across the county. Late fall through early spring is the busiest season for trail work thanks to cooler temperatures and fewer biting insects. Routine work includes mowing, lopping, chipping, blazing, and boardwalk repairs. We also utilize our in-house arborists to remove dead and damaged trees that present a hazard to trail users.

Check out page 19 of this guide for our current hiking programs, or visit our trails on your own. We will also be celebrating National Trails Day at Jakes Branch County Park in Beachwood on June 7, 2025, with activities for the whole

family.

"I encourage all of our residents to take advantage of our beautiful parks and trails," Commissioner Arace concluded. "Spending time outdoors is one of the best ways to recharge and stay healthy. I look forward to seeing many of you at our parks this season!"

On behalf of our hard-working trail crews, we invite you to enjoy our trails this

season and experience all of the beauty of your Ocean County Parks!

The Natural Lands Trust Fund Program

Colliers Mills Ext. II

Colliers Extension II is a 15.80-acre Natural Lands acquisition located in Plumsted Township off Pinehurst Road. This piece of land is located next to Colliers Mills Wildlife Preserve which makes it a wonderful addition to our Natural Lands program. This property is a mix of Pine Barrens and dense upland forests.

This heavily wooded property is home to many endangered species of plants and animals, making this the perfect place for nature enthusiasts to spot rare species. Birdwatchers are specifically drawn to this area due to its over 140 different bird species including waterfowl and migratory species. With this property being located right next to the Colliers Mills Wildlife Preserve it gives the wildlife in the area more room to thrive and grow. Colliers Mill Ext. II is the prime location for residents who appreciate nature and are looking for a peaceful retreat in the heart of Ocean County's diverse land-scape.



Natural Lands Trust

The Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Program was established to acquire and maintain environmentally sensitive lands, natural areas or open spaces that would generally remain in their natural state and for the preservation of farmland. The objective of the program is to establish of a system of protected lands which, in combination with the Farmland Preservation Program, enhance the quality of life in Ocean County by:

Helping to maintain the County's rural characteristics;
Protecting critical environmental resources and water supply;
Maintaining and enhancing active agriculture;
Buffering areas that are not compatible with development.

The program generates over \$10 million per year for natural lands acquisitions and farmland preservation. Several important parcels have been preserved and acquired through partnerships with non-profits, municipalities and the US Fish and Wildlife Service.


Night of the Stars

Recycling Our Resources: Tours of Ocean County Northern Recycling and the Ocean County Utilities Authority Water Treatment Plant




